Publishing Arrangements for Obtaining Views of Staff and Students

Following the changes made in the Education Act 2011, the College's Instrument and Articles of Government were amended to include a new Article – 3(1)(aa) – that requires the Governing Body to publish its arrangements for obtaining the views of staff and students on the determination and periodic review of the educational character and mission of the College and the oversight of its activities.
