

Progression Agreement

Between:

Wakefield College

and

All secondary schools and academies.

For progression to:

Level 1 Programmes

from

Key Stage 4 with the appropriate entry qualifications for their chosen area of study.

This Progression Agreement applies to entry from September 2012. This Progression Agreement is initially agreed for a 3 year period. The content of this Progression Agreement will be evaluated by Wakefield College, annually in June of each year.

1. Programme Entry Criteria

To study for a Level 1 programme at Wakefield College, young people should have achieved a minimum of Entry Level 3 qualifications in English and maths. Additional entry requirements which are specific to particular programmes will apply. These can be found in the Wakefield College prospectus or online at www.wakefield.ac.uk/studywithus

(Where the young person has not yet achieved a Level 2 qualification in English and/or mathematics, they must undertake a programme of study which will enable them to work towards this. It is anticipated that the majority of young people on Level 1 programmes will undertake Level 1 Functional English and Level 1 Functional maths.)

2. Application Process

Young people meeting these requirements should apply to access Level 1 programmes at Wakefield College using the Common Application Process via www.applywakefield.org.uk or through the College's application form which is available in our prospectus on via

http://www.wakefield.ac.uk/ Downloads/FullTimeApplicationForm.pdf

Learners who have met the entry criteria and demonstrate enthusiasm and commitment to the programme, will be guaranteed an initial interview at the College. If learners have not yet met the entry criteria, but there is evidence from the sending school that they expect this to be the case, learners will be guaranteed an initial interview at the College.

Information regarding the particular needs of a learner (e.g. additional support needs) will be shared between representatives for the purposes of admissions and student support, in line with the Wakefield College's standard procedures, data protection policy and safeguarding policy.

Young people are invited to attend Wakefield College's Open Evening for post-16 provision during Year 11.

4. Personal, Career and Development Planning

Partner schools should complete an at-risk form for any student whom they believe to require additional support, advice or monitoring and forward this to Wakefield College before the end of year 11 or on request.

Young people are encouraged to prepare an Individual Learning Plan during Key Stage 4, in partnership with their school or Connexions PA, to help them fulfil the requirements set out in this Progression Agreement.

Young people will be supported via a Personal Tutor upon successfully joining provision.

Impartial information, advice and guidance (IIAG) is available before, during and after a young person's time at Wakefield College. They will receive support in taking the next step in their learning or to employment.

- Literacy/English
- Numeracy/Maths

A Level 1 programme may include additional qualifications.
